MERCER COUNTY INSURANCE FUND COMMISSION AUTHORIZING DISCLOSURE OF LIABILITY CLAIMS CHECK REGISTER

WHEREAS, the MERCER COUNTY INSURANCE FUND COMMISSION (hereinafter "MCIFC") is duly constituted as an Insurance Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:10-6 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the MCIFC is a public agency which must comply with the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) N.J.S.A. 47: 1A-1 to -13; and

WHEREAS, the MCIFC must comply with OPRA and reported New Jersey Case Law interpreting same; and

WHEREAS, the MCIFC did hold a closed session from which the public was excluded on July 28, 2025 at which time certain items were discussed as were referenced in a separate resolution authorizing said closed session and it being determined certain liability & property claim payment information can be made public at this time; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of said Mercer County Insurance Fund Commission pursuant to both the Open Public Meetings Act and the Open Public Records Act as follows:

The attached financial transaction logs generated by third party administrator Inservco Insurances Inc. for the period July 1, 2025 to July 31, 2025 and August 1, 2025 to August 31, 2025 related to all non-workers compensation payments are hereby approved for distribution to the listed claimants and for disclosure to the general public

The specific litigation is identified by the claim number assigned by Inservco in its capacity as the third-party claims administrator, name of the claimant, date of loss, workers' compensation petition number and/or court assigned docket number which is set forth in the attached list which list is also appended to the MCIFC monthly meeting agenda for September 22, 2025 which agenda has been timely posted per the Open Public Meetings Act.

The minutes of said closed session shall be made available for disclosure to the public consistent with N.J.S.A. 10:4-13 when the items which are the subject of the closed session discussions are resolved and the reasons for confidentiality as to both the MCIFC and the claimant no longer exist.

Executive Director referred to an overview of the responsibilities of the position and a research paper demonstrating the importance of training for the County Park Rangers enclosed within the agenda packet. Executive Director reported that a meeting is being scheduled with the County, JAM, PERMA and Acrisure to discuss. Chairman Marion asked that J.A. Montgomery conduct a survey to determine what other counties have that type of licensing. Chairman Marion noted that he has received feedback from several directors stating that the training/licensing may not be a good idea based on the current responsibilities of the Park Rangers and whether those additional powers/duties should be assigned to them. Chairman Marion added that there are also budgetary concerns.

NEW JERSEY COUNTIES EXCESS JOINT INSURANCE FUND – Executive Director rerported that the NJCE met virtually on Friday, June 13th.
